#### PASTOR'S DESK

Happy Fall, Emmanuel UMC!

It feels like I am often looking for a new start. A new season, a new month, a new week can all be times of renewal and to finally begin the practices or habits that will lead to our transformation. Maybe you are that way, too. Maybe you get excited about the start of something new.

It made me wonder about the start of new ministry here at Emmanuel. As I continue to get to know both our church and the community around us, I have only seen incredible opportunities: new developments going in; place where multiple generations are gathering; needs of hurting, lonely and hungry people. The question is: are we ready for the change required to do this ministry work?

If we are honest, the most likely answer is, "Yes, but..." There are a lot of reasons we stop ourselves from embracing the change. There are logistical concerns. There are feelings associated with what was. There is ownership and worries about how our church might change.

I am currently reading a book by Robert Schnase called Just Say Yes! It is a challenge forme to consider the ways I say no to what God has for God's church. While I think it is helpful to acknowledge that change brings loss, I also fear the loss of missing out on joining in God's mission for Bradenton. The Spirit is moving, and I can't wait to hear some ideas worth saying yes to!

#### This is something which ALL members of Emmanuel UMC can do, not just the greeters!

5 minutes before and after service, make sure you meet someone you never met.

Avoid leading with the question, "Is this your first time?" Because it may not be. They may have been there for years, but your paths never crossed. Simply offer a, "I

don't think we've met vet" or the simple, "Hi, my name is so and so, what's yours?"

The 10 refers to distance. When someone you haven't met is within 10ft of you, go and greet them. Even if you're standing in an already established circle, have the courage to excuse yourself and break the circle to greet the person you haven't had the opportunity to meet yet. In fact, if you had to break the circle to greet them, invite them in the circle of fellowship you were already standing in which leads to the last rule: Link.

"Link" refers to connecting them to other people in the church. In the process of getting to know them (their name, where they're from, what work they do) perhaps they have something in common with someone you already know. Maybe they just started teaching at a local elementary school and your friend works at that same school. Connect them to your friend.

We cannot have a passive mindset when we're working on making people feel welcome. We have to be active and intentional and diligent. We also have to take a risk, in the sense that we may have to step out of our comfort zone to really greet someone we may not know at church. People come to church — not just to connect with God, but with God's people as well. Everyone is in need of a community. Each of us have the power and ability to help someone feel a sense of belonging in your community.

Don't be passive with that responsibility. Make the best of it and continue to connect people to your community and to God.



# Why Do You Ring?



(Excerpts from an article by Jennifer Cauhorn, "Overtones Handbell Magazine" These were some of her thoughts after serving on the faculty of "Worship and Arts Conference" in Hunt, Texas.)

I have observed a group of people deeply committed to making music and using it to praise God and enrich their faith and worship experiences. For many at his event, music and the arts are their path to worship. For others, worship is their path to the arts.

What is it about handbells that meets our musical, artistic, and spiritual needs?

Those new to the instrument can be successful at the beginning levels quickly. At the same time, handbells are challenging to the most advanced musicians. A skilled director is able to assign music in a way that will allow musicians of multiple skill levels to participate in the same ensemble and make it a fulfilling experience for all

Handbells played in ensembles are a true team sport.

There are no stars in a handbell choir. Every member is equally important to the end result.

When members connect on multiple levels—musical, technically, emotionally—the final result is magical.

I love the connection with other musicians and the feeling when the end result becomes greater than the sum of its parts. It feeds my soul and spirit.

## **Changed by the Storm**

A storm featured prominently in John Wesley's own spiritual formation. After studying at Oxford, John Wesley went to Savannah Georgia for two years as a missionary. During the trip across the seas, his boat encountered a huge storm. According to his journals, the main sail was split in pieces and water rushed aboard and he felt as if they were being swallowed by the deep. Also aboard the ship were German believers. He had observed that while aboard they took the jobs no one wanted, stating that their Savior had done more for them than they could do for others. During the storm, rather than panic, they sang and gave praise to God. John Wesley asked about the experience afterwards and stated that they said they were not afraid to die.

Friendship with the Moravians flourished during John Wesley's time in Georgia and continued after returning to England. In them, John Wesley found a greater appreciation for the movement of the Spirit and a personal piety that provided peace and assurance in Christ. This combined with the social holiness in his faith practice allowed for deep growth.

What personal practices help deepen your faith? You can also see the resources below for some suggested scripture passages to consider carefully over the next week.

## **Spiritual Practices:**

Grounding passages (Commit the following passages to memory, or create a piece of art (or write a poem), or write them on a piece of paper where you see them regularly)

- "Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God." (1 John 4:7, NRSV)
- "...God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them." (1 John 4:16b, NRSV)
- "Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves has fulfilled the law." (Romans 13:8, NRSV)
- "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34b-35, NRSV)
- "...'you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength'... 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." (Mark 12:30-31, NRSV)
- "And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love." (1 Corinthians 13:13, NRSV)
- "Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony". (Colossians 3:14)

- Sit in silence for 10 minutes, asking God to speak a word to you.
